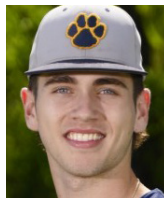

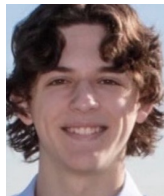


### ARLINGTON CATHOLIC
